LETTER FROM OUR EMPLOYMENT SERVICES DIRECTOR

Hello! I'm "the new guy," now managing the Employment Services programs at Willis Dady. What an honor to serve our community in this role. I have a long background in for-profit business leadership and couldn't be more excited to help build out the Employment Services programs.

What I have discovered since joining Willis Dady is the tremendous progress the team has already made in developing the Employment Services programs:



- We conduct workplace training and certifications in topics such as computer skills and forklift operation to help those needing specific skills to qualify for employment.
- We have developed employment opportunities with partners in the community. We have a strong partnership with Frontier Co-op placing apprentices for work in the manufacturing and distribution operations, offering training and transportation to help overcome barriers to employment. Many of the apprentices transition to permanent full-time employment with Frontier Co-op.
- We have successfully piloted the start of a mattress recycling operation in our Employment Hub location. We employ 5-10 associates, often facing significant barriers to employment, and have dis-assembled an average of 25 mattresses a month this year.

What's next? Marin Noska, our Employment Services expert, and I intend to expand all three programs: increasing training offerings, adding employment partnerships and getting Mattress Recycling fully operational. We believe there is significant opportunity for us to increase the service we provide for the community.
